# Learn to think globally

The Hamilton and Alexandra College nurtures students locally, so that they can excel globally.

At College, students are provided with a breadth of opportunities and are encouraged to step outside their classroom to place themselves in situations that are new, different and sometimes difficult.

Principal Michael Horne explained that the School does this because students derive great benefits from being challenged.

"At College, we are committed to providing opportunities for international and local cultural engagement, so that our graduates arrive into a world they are comfortable in and knowledgeable about," Mr Horne said.

"It is argued that students will need different skills to succeed in the future. It is true that technology is advancing quickly, and this requires us to adapt at a faster speed. However, many of the traits that will differentiate students and set them up for success remain strikingly familiar – the ability to converse, to persuade, to be adaptable and forward thinking, and to discern and use good judgement.

"Traveling, participating in service work and experiencing new cultures helps to form these successful traits to establish their confident futures beyond school," said Dr Horne.

This is not a new approach.

The College has a long history of providing opportunities beyond

the classroom for students, whether it be international study tours, co-curricular competitions, city excursions, drama and musical productions, or excursions to local businesses, farms and service providers.

Last year, the 2025/2026 Local and Global Co-Curricular Tours were launched, providing a range of options for students to consider outside of the school camps program.

In 2025, students are participating in cultural and service-learning tours to China, Central Australia and Sri Lanka. In 2026, four trips are being offered, including a

French Language and Art Tour, a Model UN Conference, New Zealand Hockey and Netball Tour and the Year 10 Central Australia Cultural Immersion.

## Light at The End of the Tunnel

At the time of writing, (mid-June) we've just received what is hopefully regarded as drought breaking rain.

Dependent upon location, the last 18 months (and more particularly this year) in Western Victoria has been regarded by most, as the worst drought in people's living memory. This has obviously impacted on rural land prices. Whilst as a generalisation, we have witnessed a decline in land prices from between 20 per cent and 40 per cent since the lofty times of the Spring of 2021 and the Autumn of 2022. Moreover, since last Spring the rate

of transactions have declined appreciably and days on market have significantly lengthened. However, there has been pockets of isolated examples of strong sales, which has been generally underpinned by strong local competition, particularly from neighbours.

Whilst the drought has affected the Rural land market from a presentation perspective, and from a buyer's confidence and financial capacity, the big positive is commodity prices. As many who have witnessed a severe drought previously generally speaking, were at the mercy of

the markets due to oversupply and unloading of livestock, this drought has proved the opposite with record lamb and mutton prices received over the Winter period, and beef remains at strong levels throughout the drought. Opening milk prices are either side of \$9 kg/milk solids and grain prices remain strong and fodder due to the drought is at record levels and almost un procurable. Furthermore, the forecast is for interest rates to decline further, and a favourable Australian dollar appears to be assisting our exports.

It is generally anticipated that

due to the above-mentioned reasons, and particularly low sheep, beef and dairy cattle numbers, that the Agricultural sector will bounce back quite quickly in the Spring given a normal season.

How long these positive above-mentioned factors will take to stimulate the rural property market is unknown, but we are "a resilient bunch" in the agricultural sector and "there is certainly light at the end of the tunnel."

After progeny have passed these and a visual appraisal, the results will be assigned to each of the parents so that only the best mature animals are retained for stud use alongside the next drop

being progeny tested.

This rigorous decision making process has placed Gringegalgonia Merinos in a strong position to rebound from dry times.

They are excited to lamb down and see the marking and weaning results of their 2,000 maiden commercial ewes which were joined for 4 weeks scanning out at 93 per

cent in lamb.

Gringegalgonia Merinos will have 20 non mulesed poll rams available for sale as part of the Glenelg Regional Merino Field Day on Monday August 11.

Included in these will be stud sire 230372 who has over 80 progeny for this year already recorded in Merino Select.

The Stud Park South commercial sheep on Edgarley at Willaura reflect our breeding objectives with wool cuts generally averaging around 6.5kgs and preg scanning rates pushing 170 per cent in our mixed age ewes.

However this year the drought conditions have significantly impacted these numbers.

Over 700 bales of wool were produced in the 2024/25 year.

The continued dry conditions have meant sacrifice paddocks and containment areas have been crucial to looking after pastures for spring lambing ewes.

However minimal rainfall and frosts have impacted any pasture growth.

Pregnant ewes will be split into twins and singles in small mobs to hopefully achieve the best results given the challenging conditions.

We look forward to welcoming visitors to our Field Day on Friday October 17.

Quality Poll and Horn rams will be offered at our annual On-property Ram Sale on Tuesday October 21 at Edgarley woolshed, 724 Delacombe Way, Willaura Vic 3379.

Now alpaca shearers can use a traditional handpiece that is slim to hold but now with the speed that they can reduce to the same as a clipper.

The brushless motor means the battery lasts even longer as it is possible to crutch up to 300-400 sheep from one charge.

Our farmers have long been the backbone of this region, driving its prosperity and resilience. As their federal representative, I remain deeply committed to advocating for our sheep and wool industries – particularly now, as they confront a crippling drought and mounting financial pressures that require strong, practical responses.

The major concern facing our drought-stricken farmers is that the traditional financial assistance



offered by the Albanese and Allan Labor Governments doesn't reflect the urgent situation on the ground. Immediate additional support in the form of interest-free or low-interest

loans is essential – without it, many farmers will be left with no choice but to sell off their breeding stock, as they simply can't afford to feed or, in some cases, even water them.

Losing high-quality breeding stock would cause long-term damage to our agricultural sector while interest-free loans would allow farmers to refinance and survive through to Spring.

This support must be delivered without delay.

Farmers are also deeply concerned about the Emergency Services and Volunteers Fund levy.

The Allan Labor State Government's decision to pause the

planned increase for one year is a short-term reprieve, not a solution.

Unless the levy hike is scrapped permanently, farmers will face even steeper costs next year as the government will almost certainly attempt to claw back lost revenue. This ongoing uncertainty will further strain their mental health and deny them the stability they need to rebuild.

I will continue working with state politicians, local councils and the community to fight for the permanent removal of the levy increase. In a time of drought and financial strain, our farmers need lasting relief – not political delays.







The board design allows rousies to work above chest height when removing stained wool and picking up fleeces. This helps reduce repetitive strain injuries and fatigue and is also more time efficient.

For the shearers the board configuration provides good vision of the board and wool room and an individual work area and allows them to move around the board easily.



# Dual-purpose machine

The conveyor extension is particularly useful in wet conditions, as the machine can feed without having to drive over muddy or pugged ground. It also eliminates the need to manoeuvre a tractor and feeder through gateways or a surrounding mob of stock.

Additionally, a mechanically adjustable linkage controls the angle of the optional conveyor tip, allowing users to fine-tune the feed delivery to suit their conditions.

# Farmers plugging in

In September, hundreds of Australian producers will "shut the farm gate" and head to the nation's capital. No, not to protest, but to lead.

The Farming Forever National Summit will unite more than 300 attendees in Canberra, including farmers, innovators and policy influencers to partner, share insights and shape the future of farming using a nature-positive lens.

Farmers for Climate Action (FCA) will host the event.

FCA CEO Natalie Collard, and former Food and Fibre Great South executive officer, said farmers were already adopting clean tech, slashing inputs and stacking new income streams — all from the same piece of land.

"Farmers are driving the move toward nature-friendly farming — 71 per cent are self-funding climate action such as clean energy to future-proof their farms," said Ms Collard.

"Australian farmers have always been clean and green and now we're extending that to be as friendly to nature as possible."

"This summit puts that leadership on the national stage and gives producers the tools to adapt — on their terms."

Hold at Hotel Realm, Canberra on 1 – 2 September, the summit marks 10 years of FCA's farmer-led movement.

wind turbine hosted on their property — while still using 98

percent of their land for food production.



## Glimmer of hope

There is a glimmer of light at the end of the gloomy tunnel of carbon footprint reduction on the farm.

With the threat of ever-intensifying compliance pressures and the associated risk of price penalties or disbarment from overseas markets, farmers need a bit of good news.

Some has recently come to light from a French scientist leading a team of researchers at the John Innes Centre in Norwich, England.

Dr Myriam Charpentier leads a team that has been working on *Medicago truncatula*, the humble Barrel Medic, an annual clover-like legume used widely in mixed farming regimes in Australia.

Like all legumes, Barrel Medic "fixes" atmospheric nitrogen through a symbiotic (mutual back-scratching) relationship with a host of microorganisms called rhizobia and arbuscular mycorrhizal fungi (AMF), which have their home in nodules on the medic's roots.

Team Charpentier found that a gene mutation in the medic could, when it occurred in wheat, enhance colonisation of the wheat's roots by AMF. This is a significant breakthrough in what has been a long quest to use symbiotic partnerships as a natural alternative to inorganic fertilisers in major cash crops, includ-

ing cereals and oilseeds, as well as legumes and pulses.

### Inorganic fertilisers

Inorganic fertilisers are essential to farming, but they come with some serious greenhouse gas-baggage.

It has been estimated that nitrogenous fertilisers are responsible for feeding 40 to 50 per cent of the world's population.

Their manufacture is almost universally dependent on the Haber-Bosch process, which was invented by Fritz Haber (Germany) in 1909 and industrialised by Carl Bosch (Germany) in 1913. Both were awarded separate Nobel prizes in 1918 and 1931, respectively.

### An agronomist's opinion

Andrew Speirs, Meridian Agriculture director, is a well-known agronomist active across the Lower South-East and the Green Triangle.

He said that he had advised a number of farmers on emissions reductions but stressed how difficult it can be.

Regarding the research announcement, he said: "This is a great project. It started as blue-sky which, by its very nature, means you don't know what you are going to get at the outset, or you wouldn't do it. It could make a huge difference."

could be done, and discovered that it was being used as wool pellets, harnessing the natural properties the wool has.

"Crossbred wool value is still low, and won't dramatically increase," she said.

So she bought a pellet mill, began her entrepreneurial journey at the then-named Aussie Wool Pellets (now WoolGrow Australia), and began producing in early 2023.

"The wool pellets are a soil amendment, they harness the natural properties of wool, like the slow release nitrogen, they hold three times their weight in water, they break down in six to 12 months into 50 per cent carbon, and can be used on top of soil as slug and snail repellent."

"Using crossbred wool gives the wool new life potential but it gets people talking about the properties of wool, as many do not understand how good Australian wool is," Ms Symons continued.

"I encourage people to buy local, and support local business, especially with drought and in the current economy. It is really integral to keep local businesses going."

Ms Symons has seen a decrease in the value of broad crossbred wool, so she began to research what



as one of the School Captains. In a rare quirk, he will follow in the footsteps of his older brother, Hudson, who was elected captain in 2024.


While Sacha still relishes her time at home on the farm, she feels that her integration into busy boarding school life was a seamless one.

# Resilience amidst change

The latest Sheep Producers Intentions Survey (SPIS), conducted by Meat & Livestock Australia (MLA) and Australian Wool Innovation (AWI), reveals a significant shift in producer sentiment and flock management strategies across the nation.

This shift is being driven by volatile market conditions, extreme weather events, and regulatory changes, most notably the planned phase-out of live sheep exports.

The survey, which gathered responses from 2,374 producers across Australia in May 2025, shows a net sentiment score of +52 for the sheepmeat industry, up 48 points from the same time last year.

This marks the first time since October 2022 that all states, including Western Australia, have reported positive or neutral sentiment.

Western Australia, which had a net sentiment of -64 in May 2024, has now reached neutral ground at 0 net sentiment. Other states' levels include:

- New South Wales: +60
- Victoria: +58
- South Australia: +56
- Tasmania: +55
- Queensland: +53
- Western Australia = 0

MLA's Senior Market Information Analyst Erin Lukey said the strong sentiment among sheepmeat producers was closely tied to improved prices across the country.

"Prices have risen significantly, particularly for finished lambs, which has buoyed confidence even as producers face tough seasonal

and regulatory conditions," Ms Lukey said.

"This is especially the case in Western Australia, where the rebound in sentiment has been most pronounced."

Despite the optimism, producers continue to navigate a range of challenges.

"Drought in the south and flooding in the north are making it more difficult and expensive to maintain large flocks," Ms Lukey said.

"Weather remains the most

cited factor influencing on-farm decisions, with significant drought in South Australia, Victoria and southern New South Wales reducing pasture availability and increasing feed costs."

The survey forecasts a 9 per cent reduction in the national breeding ewe flock, from 48.88 million in 2025 to 44.34 million in 2026, and an 11 per cent decline in the wether flock, from 7.67 million to 6.85 million.

These reductions are being

driven by strategic downsizing and environmental pressures.

"In Western Australia alone, the breeding ewe flock is forecast to fall by 19 per cent, with 58 per cent of producers in the state planning to reduce numbers," Ms Lukey said.

"Many producers are taking a more conservative approach. Nationally, 41 per cent of surveyed producers said they will reduce their breeding ewe flock, and 26 per cent plan to reduce their wether numbers."

The survey also explored the broader factors influencing on-farm decisions.

"Input costs, labour availability, and regulatory pressures, particularly the live sheep export phase-out, are weighing heavily on producers' minds," Ms Lukey said.

"While producers in Western Australia are wary of investing in flock growth amid uncertainty about future market access, others are adjusting breeding strategies or retaining more replacement ewes to adapt to changing conditions."

Despite these challenges, the resilience of the industry remains evident.

"Producers are adapting. Whether it's retaining more replacement ewes, adjusting breeding strategies, or responding to market demand, the sector continues to evolve," Ms Lukey said.

The SPIS is a critical tool for industry planning, providing valuable insights for producers, processors, and policymakers alike.

"This data helps us understand where the industry is heading and how we can support producers through change."



# Making our farms safer

Promoting farm safety, animal welfare and biosecurity across Victoria is the aim of two Victorian Farmers Federation projects.

The Making Our Farms Safer (MOFS) and Stock Sense project teams are set to be at Sheepvention this August, on-hand to answer all your farm safety and livestock questions.

Stock Sense, which is funded by the Cattle and Sheep and Goats Compensation Funds, helps Victorian livestock producers and small landholders maintain and improve their animal health and welfare and farm biosecurity.

They do this through free online resources like webinars and factsheets, as well as facilitating educational workshops across the state.

Similarly, the MOFS team regularly hit the road, travelling across the state to conduct free farm safety visits and community meetings, while also putting out a monthly newsletter and a toolkit of handbooks and resources to assist and educate farmers on implementing and maintaining safety.

VFF president Brett Hosking spoke highly of the two projects and the benefits they provide for Victorian farmers of all types.

"Both the Making Our Farms Safer and Stock Sense projects are great ways of engaging everyday farmers with information and facts that will actually help them in their businesses, their families and their communities to work towards better farming outcomes," Mr Hosking said.

"We're looking forward to both programs continuing to engage



# Creative sustainability

In the heart of the Southern Grampians Shire, a quiet revolution is taking shape – one that could redefine how we think about fashion, sustainability and the untapped potential in our own backyard.

Hamilton local and visionary entrepreneur, Bec Malseed, is leading the charge with her new brand, Ziake, which champions the use of locally sourced crossbred wool in accessories and outerwear garments.

For decades, crossbred wool has mainly been destined for carpets, home textiles and insulation, and rarely seen as a contender in the fashion world.

After listening to local farmers express their frustration at the lack of value-added opportunities for their wool, Bec began to ask, “Why not more? Why not coats, laptop bags, fitness mats, or even handbags?”

Eighteen months of research, including a trip to New Zealand to explore global innovations in wool, led to the birth of Ziake. Support from Australian Wool Innovation (AWI) has assisted in developing the supply chain to send Australian crossbred wool overseas for

prototype development, paving the way for full-scale production later this year.

What makes this development so compelling is not just the innovation, but the challenge it poses to synthetic-dominated retail. Crossbred wool is a natural,

biodegradable fibre – offering a sustainable alternative that breaks down at the end of its life, unlike the plastics that fill our wardrobes and landfill.

Ziake isn't just a brand; it's a call to action.

A reminder that local fibres

can be beautiful, functional, and environmentally responsible.

And this August, you will have a chance to see it all first hand at Sheepvention's Ram Shed in Hamilton, where Bec will showcase what's possible when creativity meets sustainability.

## Warm up, reconnect at Food Hub

This year's Sheepvention is set to warm both hearts and hands with the debut of a new Food Hub—a family-friendly space designed for gathering, grazing, and soaking up the best of local hospitality.

Nestled near the entrance of the expo, the Food Hub will feature a cosy fire pit, a sheltered

seating area, and a curated collection of delicious eats—ranging from hearty fare to artisan bites.

Visitors can expect a relaxed, communal atmosphere perfect for catching up with mates or taking a breather between events. And for those chilly winter moments, there may even be a cup of locally

mulled gin to help take the edge off.
